The authors take a very old-school approach, in which the opening sections of each chapter are limited to the terminology and structure of some system, and only later is there a discussion of how it works and what its significance is. This makes physiology much harder to learn than if the structural elements were given some relevance by at least a mention of their purpose. It also make for a very boring read. All the major chapters use this overly compartmentalized approach, except, oddly, Chapter 15 on the gastrointestinal system and Chapter 18 on defense mechanisms; these are the best chapters in the book, because they begin by integrating terminology and structure with function. The book has a very good glossary, includes brief answers to end of chapter problems, and contains clinical examples of malfunctioning systems. Lists of key terms at the ends of sections or chapters include the page number where they are defined. However, there are too few illustrations, and some of them are unclear. The captions are usually inadequate. The respiration chapter has no illustration of how the diaphragm and intercostal muscles move in breathing, the liver section has no diagram of liver blood flow, the muscle chapter has no diagram of smooth muscle cross-bridge cycling. The explanation of renal clearance is poor. Finally, there is no chapter or even discussion of the skin, which is the largest organ of the body. If you have a choice, pick another textbook. If this is your class text, prepare to spend a lot of time online getting better explanations than this book provides. It is better used as a reference than a learning tool. 1 of 1 people found the
