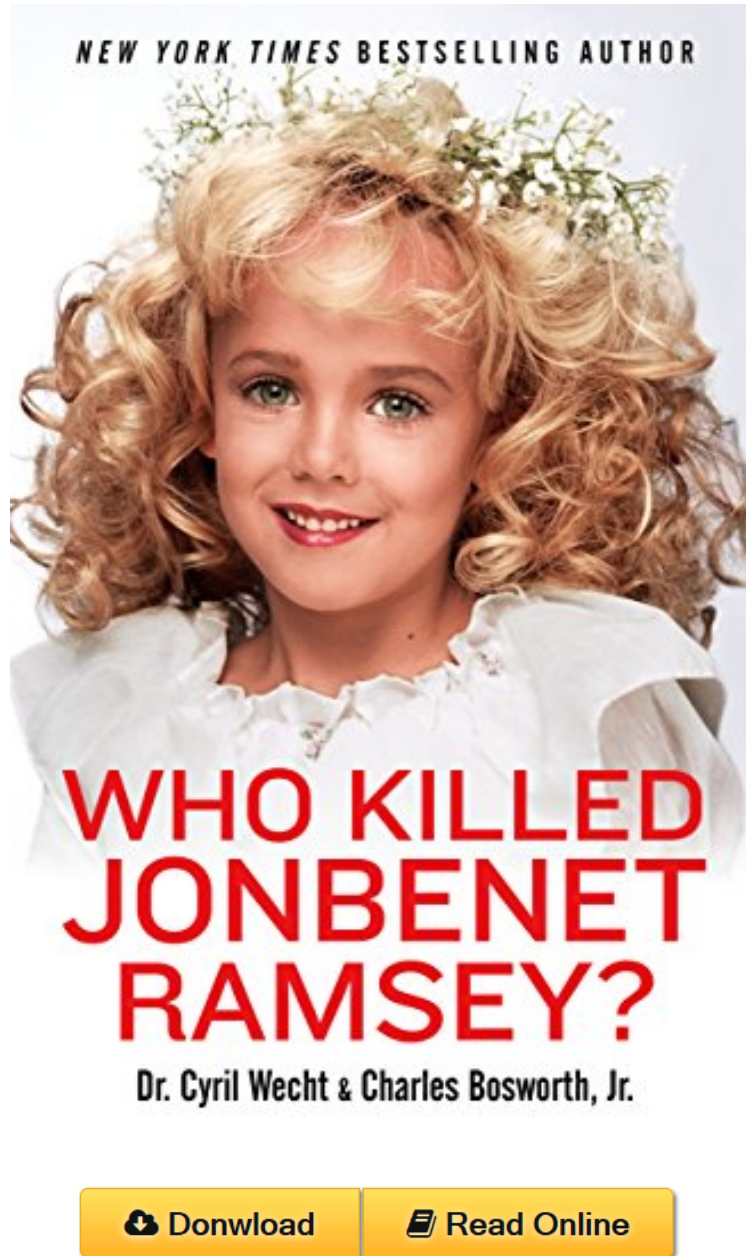

By Norma Desmond Overall, I think this is a very good book and I am not questioning Dr. Wecht's qualifications, his work or his conclusions. I think that the book could have been improved by some small editing to minimize the effusive gushing over Dr. Wecht's accomplishments. I don't know if this was done by the co-author or by Dr. Wecht himself, but the laudatory comments read like someone bragging in a high school yearbook. The language used to attempt to glorify Dr. Wecht had the opposite effect on me. I felt it was overdone, childish and unnecessary.
